We meet at the front of Reading Railway Station at 10am, and usually go (in a minibus) within five minutes. We will collect at 1.30pm as well if asked in advance - half a day's help is fine by us. We try to be back before the 5pm rush hour.

### Autumn Relaunch

Most of us are aware of the everchanging face of Berkshire's countryside and green urban areas, you may also be aware of the ecological problems that are attached to development and neglect of our environment, hedgerows that have been with us for hundreds of years are being flattened, ponds and woodland area are undermanaged and left to dis-repair. Closer to home on our own doorstep Reading's urban green areas accessible to the public have become dumping grounds for household refuse and industrial waste.

It is not only aesthetically displeasing but contributes to a breakdown in eco-systems and consequently a decline in natural habitats for wildlife.

This act of criminal folly has generated the re-launch of CROW - "Conserve Reading on Wednesdays", a local voluntary group affilliated to the B.T.C.V. - British Trust for Conservation Volunteers.

With the help and technical advice of the BTCV and Reading Rangers, we aim to carry out practical conservation work within Reading and around the Berkshire area. By doing so, CROW hopes to raise an awareness amongst the public, through involving schools and giving people the chance to participate in conservation projects - creating an understanding and giving people the chance to aquire practical skills needed for conservation activities.

There is a need for dedicated/interested people to strengthen the organisation and to increase the capacity for conservation projects. We meet fortnightly on wednesdays, there is a pick-up at the front of Reading station at 10am.

WED Sept 12th

Bulmershe Pond - One of the few remaining ponds left in this area. So we need your support to keep this site in good shape.
